Club racing has been put on hold for two weeks while the committee work hard to get permits and implement risk management. This is a huge task. Several risk management concerns were raised and drastic alterations to the club calendar have occurred. Circuits that have previously involved a stop sign are now excluded (both Cloverlea circuits and the large Jindivick loop) whilst Lillico requires a Vic Roads permit. Without a Commissaire in the near future there will be no racing at all, so the search is on. Signage is being purchased so the club can hold events with appropriate coverage. If anyone has any signs please return them ASAP. Risk management plans are being drawn up for all circuits and these are required prior to council, police and VicRoads granting approval for permits. Marshals will be required at races and they must wear correct safety gear. All cyclists must obey the Marshals, Road Rules and the Commissaire with no exceptions. You will be expected to know the appropriate hand signals and the code of conduct. The upshot of this is more volunteers and committee representatives are required if the club is to maintain its on road racing format. Whilst this is a

RISK MANAGEMENT HEADS A NEW AGENDA

The need for WCC to adopt risk management and race planning prior to obtaining permits from council, police and VicRoads has forced a small hiatus to weekly club races while the committee grapple with this issue. This edition of Cadence focuses on the Risk Management issue and its implications for WCC.

What is risk management?

There is nothing mystical about risk management and at its simplest level requires no specialist skills or knowledge.

People in sporting organisations intuitively deal with risk every day. It is important not to assume risks only take the form of physical loss or injury. This is only one component of risk management.

Applying risk management means adopting a systematic approach to how we view the **WCC** environment. Risk management helps us identify which risks are important and allows us to apply resources to these areas.

What is an Event Management Plan (EMP)?

An event management plan is essentially a Risk Management Plan with some extra considerations. It is used to help ensure the safety of those involved, along with the impact of the event on the community and club. Essentially it involves a summary of the event (including course location and suitability), control of the event (including), an evaluation as to the benefit of the event (club, sponsors, community), and general issues associated with hosting an event. A copy of all of the club's risk management documents can be found on the WCC Web Page. Please take the time to read these.

What requires an EMP?

Because all events sanctioned by the WCC pose some level of risk to the criteria listed above, all WCC hosted events (from club endorsed training/social rides to annual carnivals) require an EMP. The detail and depth of each EMP will vary according to where it is hosted, the number of people involved and the context in which it is held. Assessment and management of risks involving the completion of a Risk Management Assessment Form is a requirement of the EMP.

Why are have been racing at Shady Creek only?

This is the only circuit that the local council has approved for the WCC to use as a race circuit, utilising Risk management plans.

Will Shady Creek be used forever?

No. Risk assessments are currently being sought for other courses. This process however can take up to a month for final approval.

Why can't we race Cloverlea or Jindivick?

Both these courses have stop signs at certain intersections. Council will not approve a course which passes through a stop sign.

Near misses?

Have you been involved in a near miss circumstance during your racing or training rides? If yes please contact anyone on the committee who will record this information for future planning. This is another form of risk management in action.


